
Forked River Tuna Club's Striped Bass Tournament Rules

- 1. Boat Tournament: Maximum 6 anglers per boat at \$150 per boat
- 2. 2 fish stringer per boat, overall heaviest stringer per boat wins. In the event of a tie, the boat who weighed in first will maintain his place.
- 3. November 7 & 8, 2020 available fishing days. Captains must declare which day they are going to fish by the end of the Captains meeting. Day 1 fishing begins after the Captain's meeting. Day 2 fishing begins on Saturday November 7 at 5pm
- 4. Boat Captains can elect to fish both days for an additional cost of \$100 for up to 6 anglers. Boat Captains wishing to fish both days must pay up-front for both days during the Captain's meeting prior to the start of the tournament. There are no refunds if the captains choose not to fish the second day. Captains fishing both days can only place once on the board.
- 5. Captain's Meeting Friday November 6, 2020 at the outdoor Pavilion, at the Forked River Tuna Club. Doors open at 630pm. Meeting starts at 730pm. All provided that outdoor activities are still permitted by the Governor. Otherwise the meeting will take place over Zoom. However the boat captain must stop by the club (or in his absence his designee) to fill out waiver form and sign up prior to 7:30pm. All info will be posted up on Facebook under Forked River Tuna Club Friend.
- 6. Boats will be assigned a number in numerical order of their registration. The boat number will behanded out during the Captain's meeting. This number assigned to the boat must be visible for other boats to see during fishing hours while fishing. The boat number will also be needed for all weigh ins.

- 7. All weigh-ins will be at the Forked River Pavilion. Weigh-in times are 3pm till 6pm Saturday November 7, 2020 and 2pm till 5pm Sunday November 9, 2020. Boats can only weigh fish in once daily. Absolutely no exceptions. All weights from Saturday November 7, 2020 will be posted by 8pm on social media.
- 8. Awards will be held at 6pm Sunday November 8, 2020. Food will be served depending on current State of New Jersey regulations.
- 9. A rod and reel will go to heaviest, legal slot fish, weighed in by Junior Angler.
- 10. The weigh master will measure each fish as stated in the NJ Marine Digest



- Lay fish flat on top of, or alongside a measuring rule, not measured over the body.
- Fish are measured from the tip of the snout (mouth closed) to the longest part of the tail.

Heaviest 2 slot fish Stringer	\$100
Heaviest Slot Fish	\$50
Heaviest Bluefish	\$50
